What if there was a club that acquired and cellared wines for its members? One where you did not have to be rich to afford the initiation fee to join and gain access to the cellar? One where, in fact, there is no initiation fee and annual dues are trivial in amount? Such a wine club existing is improbable, yet Toronto is home to several. Celebrating its 50th Anniversary the Toronto Vintners Club (TVC) is the longest continuously running wine tasting club in the city



Traveling back 50 years takes you to 1975. In 1975 a Ford was not premier, but there was one in the Whitehouse. The Prime Minister's residence at 24 Sussex Drive was inhabitable, and the Trudeaus lived there. Jaws was playing in movie theaters, Captain & Tennille had the number one song, the Vietnam War ended, and a small company called Microsoft was created. If that information makes you feel like 1975 was ancient history, consider that the LCBO had dropped its passport requirement and started allowing self-service stores just 6 years prior. Courtesy of the archives at The Star, a flagship LCBO store in Toronto in 1971 looked like this:





In 1975, wine lovers were parched and sad. Where were the things we take for granted today, such as wine agents, sommeliers, or product choices? Where did wine lovers get information on countries, regions, producers, vintages, grapes, and terroir? Perhaps the most important questions are how did a wine lover explore, get experience, and meet fellow enthusiasts?

Enter the scene Ted Turner, a Toronto entrepreneur who loved wine and travel. Through his journeys, he discovered a "Vintners" club in San Francisco (founded in 1971) and thought Toronto was a community ripe for that concept.

The theme of the first tasting he organized is a mystery as the wines served ranged from an Andres wine made from the humble De Chaunac hybrid grape to the now highly sought-after **Château Rausan Segla** from Bordeaux. Perhaps one of the men standing guard behind the counter at the LCBO told Ted what he was allowed to buy and serve.



That event attracted 150 people and, from there,

attendance grew and grew. A few years later, TVC was so large that no venue in Toronto could host its events, and the sister club that would become **Winetasters (WT)** was formed.

Consider that a span of 50 years and reflect on the hundreds of events and the thousands of wines that were explored. How many friendships were spawned through the community that enjoying and learning about fine wine facilitates? Indeed, members of both clubs have a lot to celebrate. This anniversary celebrates the TVC's and WT's past, present, and future role in fostering Toronto's wine community's deep appreciation of wine. **Let's celebrate in style!**
